Resolution No. 2021-44

Supporting Reauthorization of the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program

TO THE DOOR COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, Door County has benefited in many ways over the past 30 years through grants from the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program (the Program), including over \$1 million in grants to help fund County park and marina improvements, grants to local governmental units throughout the County for a variety of projects, funds for the creation and expansion of state natural areas in the County and improvements at state parks, and grants to non-profit groups including the Door County Land Trust, The Ridges Sanctuary, Crossroads at Big Creek and The Nature Conservancy for land conservation projects that help protect our groundwater, lakes and streams, protect native flora and fauna, provide hiking, fishing and hunting access for residents and visitors and help to preserve the unique beauty and character of the County; and

WHEREAS, the total amount of the grants received by local governments and other entities in Door County under the Program from its inception more than 30 years ago is estimated to be \$30,829,500 by Gathering Waters: Wisconsin's Alliance for Land Trusts based on data from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR). This number does not include additional money from the Program used improvements to state parks and other DNR properties in the County; and

WHEREAS, in most cases the grants from the Program have enabled grant recipients to receive matching grants from various federal programs and private philanthropy, often more than doubling the impact of the Program; and

WHEREAS, the recreational projects and lands conserved through the Program have resulted in substantial economic benefits throughout the County's tourist economy by attracting, and enhancing the experiences of, the many visitors to the County; and

WHEREAS, the Program named for Republican Governor Warren Knowles and Democrat Governor Gaylord Nelson has received strong bipartisan support since its inception; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has increased use of the public and non-profit conservation lands in the County substantially and reinforced appreciation of the value of these lands dramatically; and

WHEREAS, Governor Evers has included in his executive budget (introduced as SB111) a 10-year reauthorization of the Program funded at \$70 million per year to be allocated among various components of the Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Door County Board of Supervisors does hereby strongly support reauthorization of the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program for another decade in the 2021-23 state budget presently under consideration for adoption.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Door County Clerk send a copy of this Resolution to Governor Tony Evers, Senator Andre Jacques, Representative Joel Kitchens and the Wisconsin Counties Association.
