INSPECTION CYCLE

The “Green Dot” Program is intended to provide for the periodic inspection of the City’s sidewalk network. Areas within the network will be inspected on a rotating basis, with the area size and frequency of inspection being determined by the Department ~~of Public Works~~ based upon available budgeted funds and similar resources. This periodic inspection will help to determine whether any portion of the sidewalk in the area should be considered in need of repair or replacement.

~~The downtown core area as designated on Exhibit “A” will be inspected annually.~~

~~Citizens~~ Members of the public are encouraged to report conditions that may qualify for repair or replacement to the Department. ~~of Public Works.~~

REPAIR / REPLACEMENT CRITERIA

~~In order to sustain the safety of sidewalks in the City and avoid the development of unsafe conditions, sidewalks~~ Sidewalks that meet any of the following criteria during an inspection ~~will may~~ be subject to prioritized repair or replacement at the discretion of the Department based upon available resources:

1. ¾” vertical differential between or within sidewalk sections
2. crack width of ½” between or within sidewalk sections
3. broken corners greater than 3 inches in any direction

RESPONSE TIME

All ~~reports of damaged sidewalks received by the Department~~ ~~general notification of damaged sidewalk~~ will be inspected and repaired, if necessary, within a reasonable amount of time based upon available resources, the location, amount of pedestrian traffic, overall condition of the sidewalks in the area, cost versus effect, public feedback, and at the discretion of the Department Director or designee.

ASSESSMENTS REPLACEMENT COST

Sidewalks meeting the replacement criteria above ~~will can~~ be replaced at City cost. Sidewalk sections which are out of conformance with design grade to a degree that water ponds, ~~shall can~~ be replaced at City cost when part of a Total Street Reconstruction Program. Alternatively, property owners may elect to replace sections of sidewalk which are out of conformance with design grades to a degree that water ponds, at their sole discretion and expense and with an approved City permit.

All one- or 2-family unattached buildings with overhead doors shall have at least one exit door that is a minimum of 32" in width. The overhead door shall not be used as an exit door. Accessory buildings that are 150 square feet or larger are considered a garage for the purposes of this section.

(b) *Wall brace plans.* Wall brace plans are required for accessory buildings greater in width or length than twelve (12) feet. Wall brace plans must meet UDC standards. Exterior walls and roofs shall meet UDC standards for design, structural requirements and covering. Stairs or stairways, handrails, guardrails or elevated areas inside and outside of the accessory building shall meet UDC standards.

(c) *Attached.* Attached garages, carports and shelters that are connected to a residence shall have footings and foundations to the established frost line. Attached garages with exterior siding shall be framed to meet all general requirements. Floor drains in garages shall not connect to the foundation drain tile or a clear water sump. Attached carports and unheated shelters that are designed to compensate for movement or flexing and meet all other general requirements may be erected or installed on concrete slabs without frost walls and footings, provided that detailed drawings of design and method of construction are submitted with the permit application.

(d) *Construction time frame.* Unattached garages or accessory buildings must be completed within one (1) year from the date that the building permit is issued. Failure to complete the construction of garages and accessory buildings will require a new permit. The permit fee for additional permits will be double the original permit fee.

(e) *Garage door required.* All attached and detached garages, excluding carports, must have an operating garage door.

In 2018, changes were made to this section to prohibit homeowners from doing their own service changes in their homes. The proposed changes below further clarify what is required in order to install a new service, as well as solar installations, by a home owner in their own home.

Sec. 4-392. Exemptions.

As allowed under Wis. Stats. §101.862(4)(a), a residential property owner may perform electrical work in his own dwelling which he owns and occupies without a license, ~~with the exception of installing or replacing of service equipment,~~ as long as the work is being conducted in a single-family dwelling. In the case of installing or replacing service equipment in a single-family dwelling, solar photovoltaic installations or electrical work performed on a residential property which is not a single-family owner occupied dwelling, the electrical work will need to shall be performed by a licensed electrical contractor, meeting all the requirements of SPS 305.41 as amended from time to time. The owner of the property must procure a permit prior to starting any electrical work. The property owner may not procure a permit on behalf of an electrical contractor or another individual.

Petitioner's Request: The applicant is requesting to amend the City's *Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030* Future Land Use Map from the One and Two-Family Residential designation to the Mixed Use designation for parcel #31-5-1232-00. In conjunction with this request, the applicant is proposing to rezone all four subject parcels from C-2 General Commercial District, R-2 Two-Family District, and R-1C Central City Residential District to C-1 Neighborhood Mixed Use District. The requests are being made to establish a uniform Future Land Use Map designation and zoning classification for the subject property, and in doing so, allow for future redevelopment.

BACKGROUND

On March 15, 2017, the Common Council approved/adopted the 5-year update to the *Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030* and Future Land Use Map. This plan establishes a vision for future land use, physical development, and quality of life in the City and provides a comprehensive set of goals, policies, and initiatives to achieve that vision. Zoning Ordinance Review Criteria: A rezoning is often triggered by development proposals or changing circumstances in the City. In this case, the request is being made to establish uniform zoning, allow for combining of lots via CSM, and accommodate future development. If the rezoning request is approved, any future development would need to conform to the C-1 Neighborhood Mixed Use District zoning regulations listed above and other applicable sections of the Zoning Ordinance. Ultimately, Site Plan review and approval would be required, pursuant to Section 23-570 of the Municipal Code, prior to the issuance of a building permit by the Inspections Division.

When rezoning parcels prior to a redevelopment project, the sequence of steps can be somewhat complex. Sometimes steps need to occur after the rezoning in order to achieve conformity. For example, parcel #31-5-1238-00 on its own does not meet the minimum lot area requirement for the C-1 District, but if the four lots are combined via CSM, the new lot would comply with applicable lot area and lot width standards (based on initial CSM review). Also, a duplex and parking lot are not permitted as standalone uses in the C-1 District, but a change of use is anticipated if the rezoning request is approved.

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approved, to identify this entire area for future mixed uses, the rezoning request will be in conformance with the Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030.

 3. Proposed amendments cannot be accommodated by sites already zoned in the City due to lack of transportation, utilities or other development constraints, or the market to be served by the proposed use cannot be effectively served by the location of the existing zoning district(s).
 4. There is an error in the code text or zoning map as enacted.
- b. In addition to the findings required to be made by subsection (a), findings shall be made by the Plan Commission on each of the following matters based on the evidence presented:
1. The adequacy of public facilities such as transportation, utilities and other required public services to serve the proposed site. *The subject area is served by existing infrastructure, and the transportation network should be able to accommodate the proposed rezoning.*

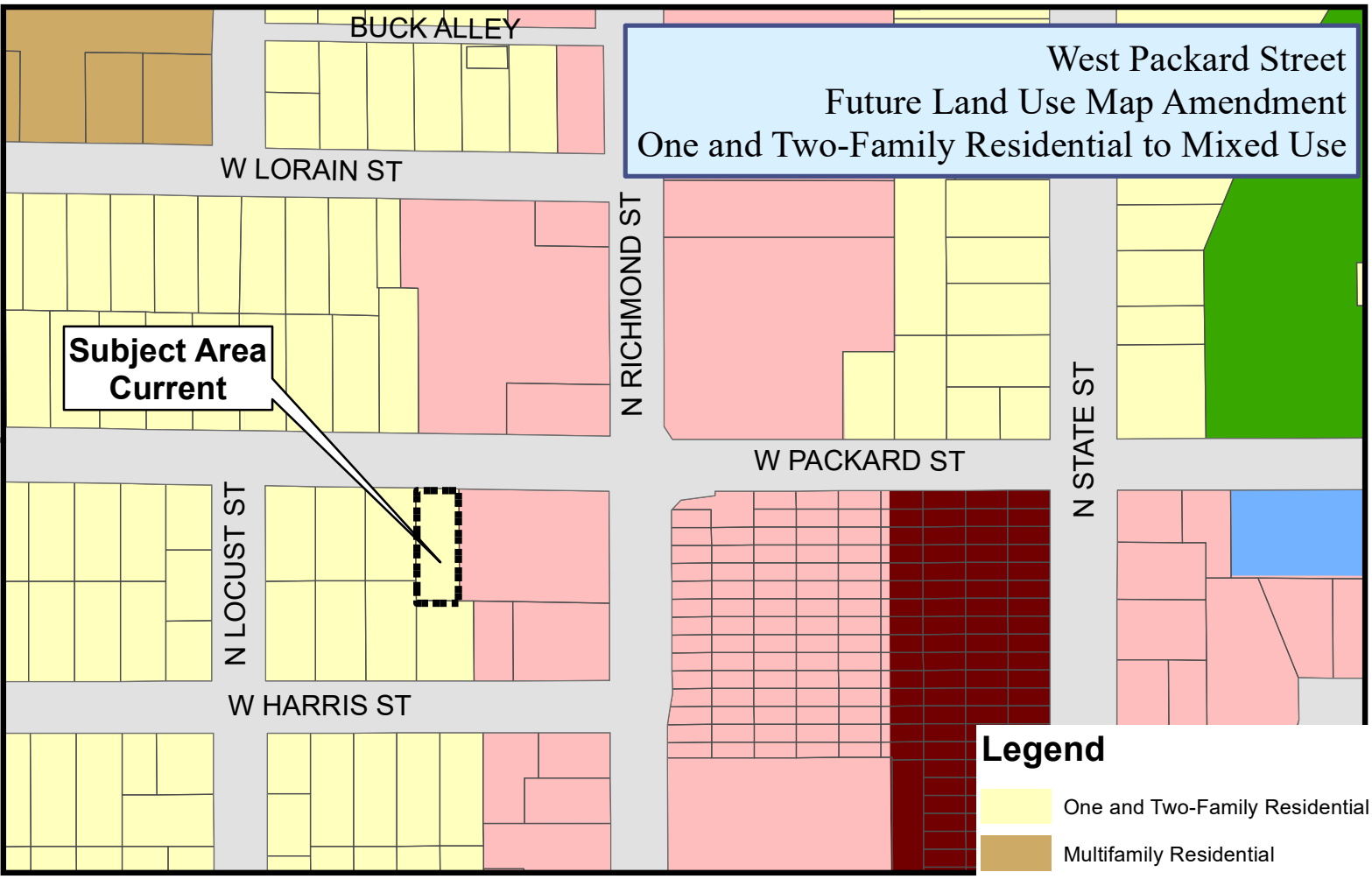

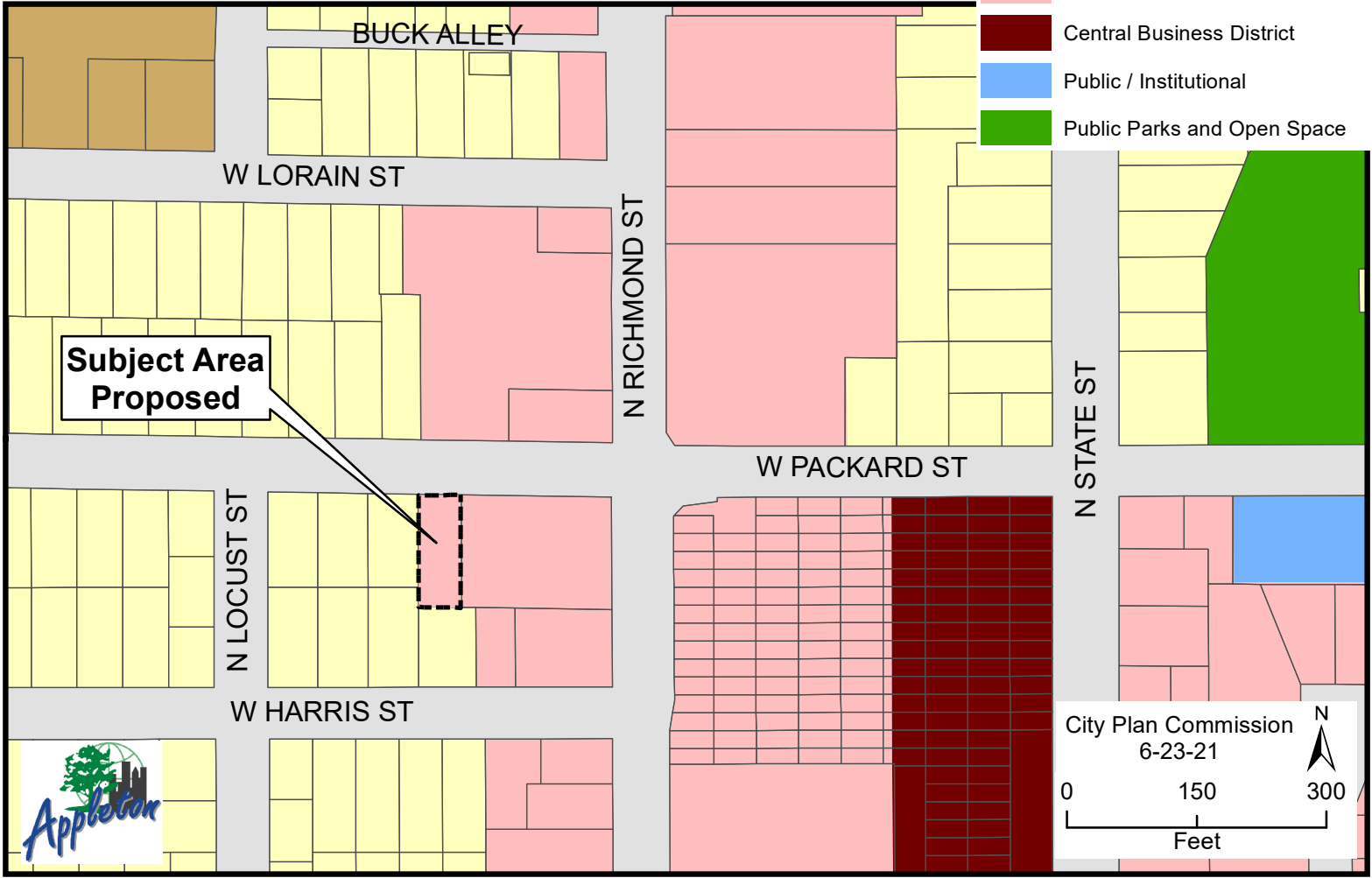

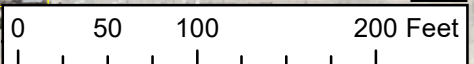

Current Land Use – Mixed-use building (Richmond Terrace) with commercial and multi-family residential.

West: Zoning – R-2 Two-Family District and R-1C Central City Residential District.
Future Land Use Designation – One and Two-Family Residential.
Current Land Use – Mix of two-family and single-family residential.

Proposed Future Land Use Designation: Amendments to the *Comprehensive Plan* are sometimes triggered by technical corrections to omissions or errors, specific development proposals, or changing circumstances in the City. In this case, a specific development proposal for the subject land area is necessitating the change to Mixed Use designation. Three of the subject parcels (#31-5-1234-00, #31-5-1236-00, and #31-5-1238-00) are already shown as Mixed Use designation on the Future Land Use Map, so the proposed amendment would represent an expansion of the Mixed Use designation and establish a uniform designation for the development area.

Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030 Goals and Objectives: The *Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030* and Future Land Use Map are intended to guide City growth and development in an organized, efficient manner. The Plan addresses a range of topics related to land use, housing and neighborhoods, economic development, transportation, utilities and community facilities, and more. Evaluating the proposed amendment for consistency with relevant goals, objectives, and policies is necessary in determining if

changes to the Future Land Use Map are appropriate. The proposed amendment appears to be consistent with the following excerpts from the City's *Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030*.

Goal 1 – Community Growth

Appleton will continue to provide opportunities for residential, commercial, and industrial growth, including appropriate redevelopment sites within the downtown and existing neighborhoods, and greenfield development sites at the City's edge.

Goal 3 – Housing Quality, Variety, and Affordability

Appleton will provide a variety of rental and ownership housing choices in a range of prices affordable to community residents, and ensure that existing housing is adequately maintained in terms of physical quality and market viability.

Goal 8 – Economic Development

Appleton will pursue economic development that retains and attracts talented people, brings good jobs to the area, and supports the vitality of its industrial areas, downtown, and neighborhood business districts.

OBJECTIVE 5.3 Housing and Neighborhoods:

Provide a range of housing options that meet the needs and appeal to all segments of the community and allows residents to age in place.

Policy 5.3.2 Identify preferred locations and encourage urban infill and redevelopment to meet the needs of retirees and Generation X and Millennial buyers or renters, such as redevelopment sites on the north side of downtown.

OBJECTIVE 10.1 Land Use:

Provide an adequate supply of suitable land meeting the demand for development of various land uses.

Policy 10.1.1 Adopt, and as necessary, amend the Future Land Use Map in the Comprehensive Plan.

OBJECTIVE 10.5 Land Use:

Support the continued redevelopment and revitalization of land uses adjacent to Appleton's key transportation corridors and downtown.

Chapter 16: Richmond Street Corridor Plan, Redevelopment Opportunities:

In the southern portion of the corridor, a large area has been identified in which redevelopment may occur. This includes approximately three blocks on Richmond Street. Market demand, traffic volume, parcel size, and current under-utilization of the space suggests that these properties are among the most likely to redevelop.

Proposed Zoning Classification: The purpose of the C-1 Neighborhood Mixed Use District is to provide for mixed use areas, including a range of commercial and denser residential uses. Development is intended to be pedestrian-oriented, with businesses and services that are part of the fabric of the neighborhood and allow residents to meet daily needs on foot, bicycle, and public transit. Development standards provide added flexibility to encourage redevelopment along commercial corridors, without

being detrimental to established residential neighborhoods. Per Section 23-112(h) of the Municipal Code, the development standards for the C-1 District are listed below:

- 1) **Minimum lot area:** 6,000 square feet.
- 2) **Maximum lot coverage:** 90%.
- 3) **Minimum lot width:** 40 feet.
- 4) **Minimum front yard:** None.
- 5) **Minimum rear yard:** 20 feet.
- 6) **Minimum side yard:**
 - a. None.
 - b. 10 feet if abutting a residentially zoned district.
- 7) **Maximum building height:** 60 feet.

Zoning Ordinance Review Criteria: A rezoning is often triggered by development proposals or changing circumstances in the City. In this case, the request is being made to establish uniform zoning, allow for combining of lots via CSM, and accommodate future development. If the rezoning request is approved, any future development would need to conform to the C-1 Neighborhood Mixed Use District zoning regulations listed above and other applicable sections of the Zoning Ordinance. Ultimately, Site Plan review and approval would be required, pursuant to Section 23-570 of the Municipal Code, prior to the issuance of a building permit by the Inspections Division.

When rezoning parcels prior to a redevelopment project, the sequence of steps can be somewhat complex. Sometimes steps need to occur after the rezoning in order to achieve conformity. For example, parcel #31-5-1238-00 on its own does not meet the minimum lot area requirement for the C-1 District, but if the four lots are combined via CSM, the new lot would comply with applicable lot area and lot width standards (based on initial CSM review). Also, a duplex and parking lot are not permitted as standalone uses in the C-1 District, but a change of use is anticipated if the rezoning request is approved.

Per Section 23-112(i) of the Municipal Code, the C-1 District shall be utilized in areas identified with a future Mixed Use designation on the Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map. Three of the subject parcels are already shown as Mixed Use designation on the Future Land Use Map, and the requested amendment would change parcel #31-5-1232-00 to Mixed Use designation as well.

Standards for Zoning Map Amendments: Per Section 23-65(d)(3) of the Municipal Code, all recommendations for Official Zoning Map amendments shall be consistent with the adopted plans, goals, and policies of the City and with the intent of the Zoning Ordinance. Related excerpts are listed below.

- a. Prior to making a recommendation on a proposed rezoning, the Plan Commission shall make a finding to determine if the following conditions exist. No rezoning of land shall be approved prior to finding at least one of the following:
 1. The request for a zone change is in conformance with the Comprehensive Plan for the City of Appleton. *The Future Land Use Map already identifies parcels #31-5-1234-00, #31-5-1236-00, and #31-5-1238-00 for future mixed uses. If Future Land Use Map Amendment #2-21 is*

approved, to identify this entire area for future mixed uses, the rezoning request will be in conformance with the Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030.

2. A study submitted by the applicant that indicates that there has been an increase in the demand for land in the requested zoning district, and as a result, the supply of land within the City mapped as such on the Official Zoning Map is inadequate to meet the demands for such development.
 3. Proposed amendments cannot be accommodated by sites already zoned in the City due to lack of transportation, utilities or other development constraints, or the market to be served by the proposed use cannot be effectively served by the location of the existing zoning district(s).
 4. There is an error in the code text or zoning map as enacted.
- b. In addition to the findings required to be made by subsection (a), findings shall be made by the Plan Commission on each of the following matters based on the evidence presented:
1. The adequacy of public facilities such as transportation, utilities and other required public services to serve the proposed site. *The subject area is served by existing infrastructure, and the transportation network should be able to accommodate the proposed rezoning.*
 2. The effect of the proposed rezoning on surrounding uses. *Commercial zoning already exists on two of the subject parcels. A mix of commercial and/or multi-family residential uses are already located north and east of the subject site, including the Richmond Terrace building directly across the street. C-1 District development standards, such as setbacks, and perimeter parking lot landscape buffers would be reviewed in accordance with Zoning Ordinance requirements at the time of Site Plan review. Therefore, the proposed rezoning request is unlikely to create adverse impacts in the surrounding neighborhood.*

Review Criteria: Based upon the above analysis, it would appear the criteria established by Section 23-65(d)(3) Zoning Amendments has been satisfied, provided Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map Amendment #2-21 is approved.

Technical Review Group (TRG) Report: These items appeared on the June 1, 2021 TRG agenda. No negative comments were received from participating departments.

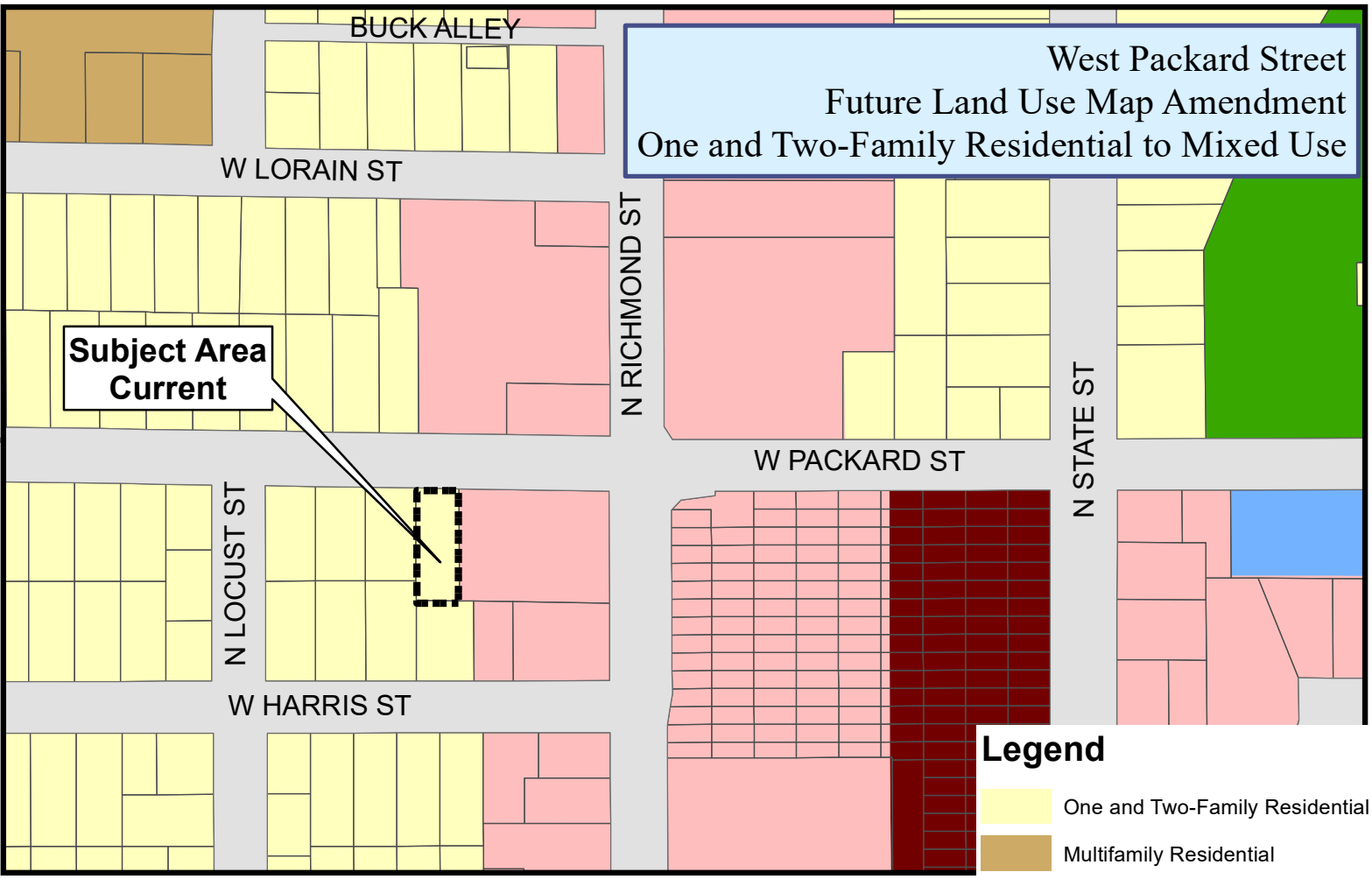

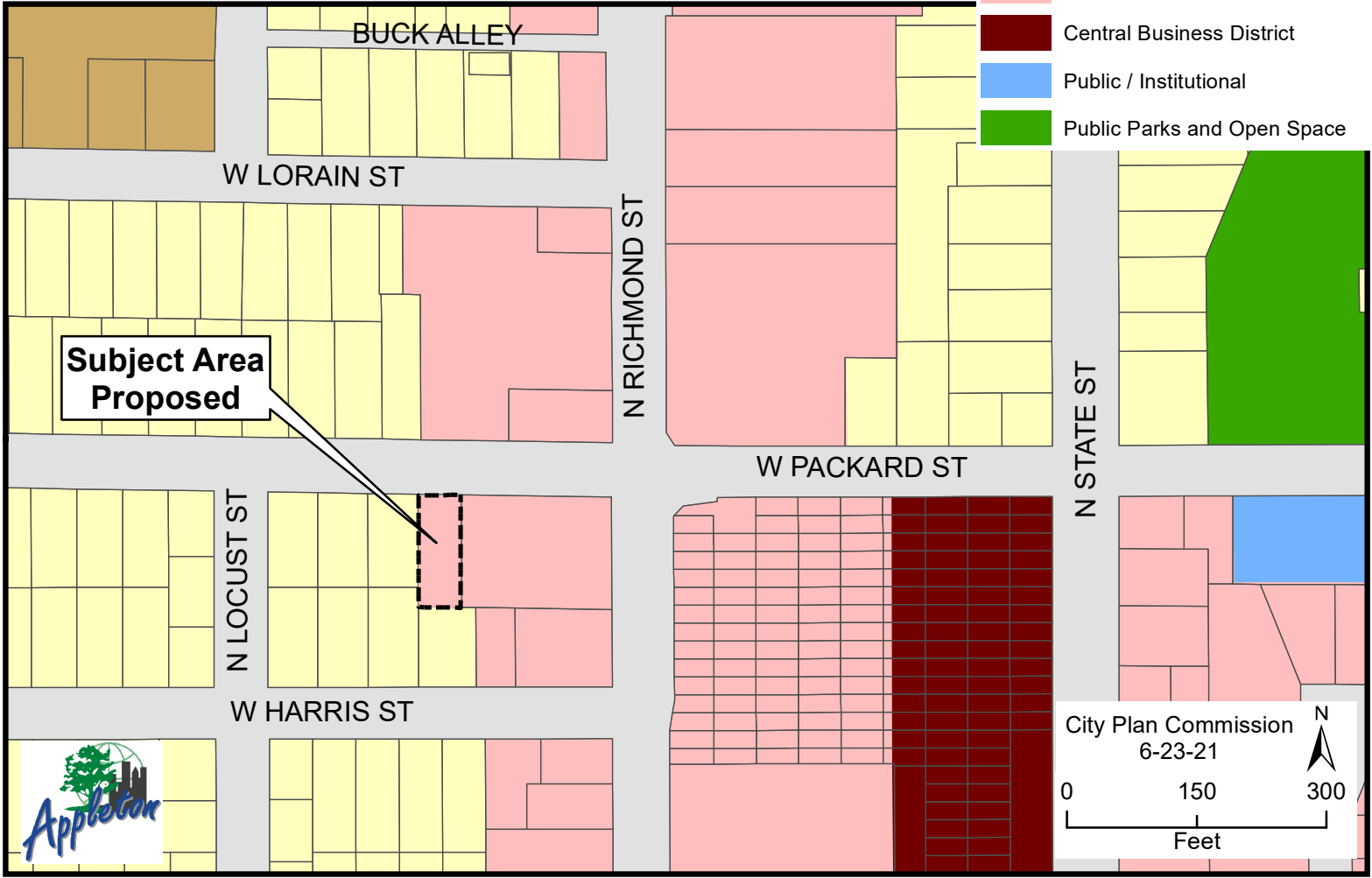
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West Packard Street

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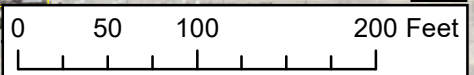

The City has a general fund balance that states:

At least 75% of general fund balance in excess of the reserve policy (currently three months operating expenditures) be used for the reduction of long-term liabilities. Utilization of the remaining funds are subject to recommendation from the Finance Committee to be used for additional reduction of long-term liabilities or general fund expenditures with final Council approval.

Each year upon the conclusion of the annual audit, the general fund balance is reviewed to determine if such excess funds are available. The audit report, presented to the Finance Committee on June 21, 2021 noted an unadjusted general fund balance of \$7,011,075 in excess of the City’s reserve policy at December 31, 2020.

Reasons for the Excess

It is unusual to have this large of an excess at year end. There were a few major factors that contributed to the excess. First, three of the City’s TIF Districts are paying back advances (loans) that the general fund made in prior years. As the advances are paid back, this adds available cash to the general fund balance. The result of these TIF advance repayments in 2020 was a \$1,660,000 increase in the unassigned general fund balance.

Second, federal CARES funding for COVID-19 relief expenses also played a significant role in generating the surplus. Approximately \$1.3 million of these grant funds were able to be used pay to for public health and public safety personnel costs which replaced the budgeted general fund spending.

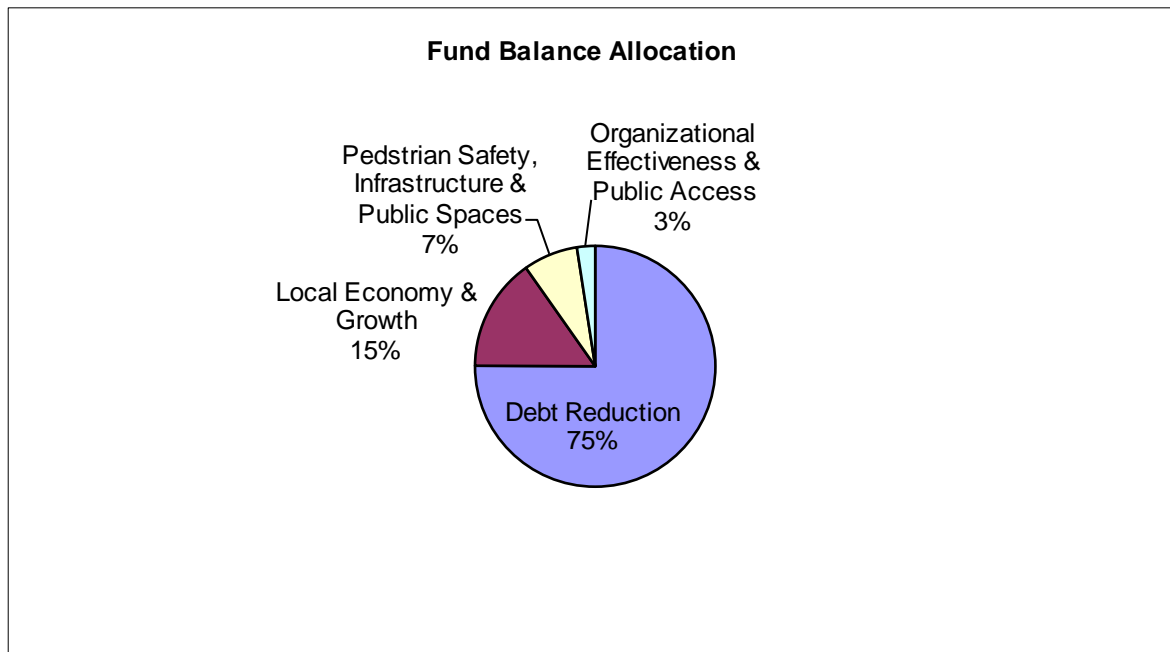
Third, overall health care claims costs and expenses were down in 2020 which generated approximately \$850,000 in savings to the general fund.

Finally, on the revenue side, the City received approximately \$850,000 of grant funds from FEMA and the State of Wisconsin in 2020 as reimbursement for storm damage cleanup costs from storms in prior years. This revenue was not included in the 2020 Budget since the approved amount and timing for receiving these funds were unknown, and extremely difficult to predict, at the time of budget preparation.

Application of the Policy

Applying the policy to the adjusted excess fund balance results in approximately \$3,840,000 (75%) being designated to be used to reduce long-term liabilities and \$1,275,000 (25%) subject to the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

Per discussion with staff, we are respectfully requesting the Finance Committee’s approval to allocate the excess fund balance as follows:

Mary Beth Nienhaus has generously offered to donate the funding to build a pickleball complex at Telulah Park. Ms. Nienhaus is a resident of Appleton and a long term advocate for physical education. During 2021, the Capital Improvement Plan included funding to design this pickleball complex, but no monies were allocated for the actual construction. Mary Beth has offered to pay up to \$500,000 towards the construction over a 5-year period. Construction of the pickleball complex would occur in 2022.

The pickleball complex would officially be named the “*Mary Beth Neinhaus Pickleball Complex*” for the life of the existing courts. The naming rights would terminate at such a time the courts would need replacement or twenty (20) years, whichever comes first.

Pickleball is one of the fastest growing sports in our area and also is the most requested amenities over the last five years. Appleton currently has no official pickleball courts and this will be a great addition to our parks and programming.

It was our department’s hope that we would able to build this complex in 2023, but with numerous priorities for funding it looked likely that this would be deferred. This donation allows our original plans to be completed and requires no tax payer funding.

The Parks, Recreation and Facilities Management Department requests your support to approve this grant. Our department would be honored to name this pickleball complex after Mary Beth Neinhaus for her support of the community.

RE: Action: Request approval of Change Order #1 for Contract 42-21 for the 2021 Parks Hardscapes Project – AMP Parking Lot #3 Reconstruction Project for installing Engineered Base Stabilizer (EBS) and drain tile in the amount of \$60,947.45 resulting in an increase of the contingency from \$50,000 to \$60,947.45 and an increase to the overall contract amount of \$10,947.45.

This change order is to add Engineered Base Stabilizer (EBS) and drain tile to the subbase of the AMP Parking Lot #3 reconstruction project. During the design for parking lot reconstruction, several soil borings were completed, and the parking lot design was based off of these soil borings. However, the soil borings only provide a very small representation of the overall surface area of the project. During the subgrade excavation, several large areas were uncovered that contained very poor saturated soils with visual confirmation of subsurface water flow. The areas with the poor soils were over excavated and EBS was installed. Drain tile was then installed to direct the subsurface flow of water into the biofilter.

RE: Request approval of Over-Hire for Help Desk Analyst

There are two Help Desk Analyst positions in the Information Technology Department who provide front-line technical support to all City departments. At the April 14, 2021 meeting of the Human Resources and Information Technology Committee meeting, the committee approved a 60-day over-hire for one Help Desk Analyst position to allow a retiring long-term staff member to provide training to her replacement. Subsequently, a new Help Desk Analyst was hired June 21, 2021 and training has been ongoing ever since and is going very well.

Unfortunately, on July 19th, we were informed that the second Help Desk Analyst, who has been with the City for approximately six years, had found another position outside the City and was resigning. His last day will be July 30, 2021.

Knowing that with this departure, the department would have only one Help Desk Analyst with barely over a month's experience, we reached out to the retiring Help Desk Analyst to see if she would consider delaying her retirement (originally scheduled for August 2, 2021) to provide training to the eventual replacement of the second Help Desk Analyst position. This would allow the department to fully staff the Help Desk during this transition as well as provide an opportunity for the two new staff members to receive valuable training from the highly knowledgeable incumbent.

I am happy to report that she has graciously agreed to do so. I cannot say enough about this generous and caring gesture and am exceptionally grateful for her willingness to stay through this transition process. She has a wealth of institutional knowledge that can not be replaced and allowing her to pass some of this knowledge along to the new staff will benefit both their professional development as well as the City as a whole.

Therefore, we are requesting another over-hire for a 60-day period to begin upon the filling of the vacant Help Desk Analyst position. The hiring process is currently underway and we hope to have someone on board by the middle of August. Under no circumstances will the over-hire extend beyond December 1, 2021 without prior approval from this committee.

The additional budget cost of the over-hire is expected to be approximately \$20,000 and can be absorbed within the current 2021 Information Technology Department budget.

Petitioner's Request: The applicant proposes to rezone the subject property from PD/C-2 Planned Development General Commercial District #34-84 to the R-3 Multi-Family District. The existing planned development district standards (PD/C-2 Planned Development General Commercial District #34-84) do not allow for a building footprint with attached garages, patios, balconies and associated outdoor parking of vehicles in a driveway leading to attached garages. The request is being made by the applicant and owner because the applicant has interest in purchasing the lot and constructing a multi-family apartment building with these features utilizing the current R-3 Multi-family District standards of the Appleton Municipal Code.

BACKGROUND

In 1985, the Calumet Street Planned Development District #34-84 (now known as PD/C-2 Planned Development General Commercial District #34-84) was approved to allow for the construction of a Shopping Center Complex with a mix of retail, professional services, personal services, restaurant uses and an 8-unit multi-family apartment building to be located on Property Tax Id#'s 31-9-1114-00, 31-9-1114-01, 31-9-1116-00, 31-9-1117-00 and 31-9-1118-00.

- The 8-unit multi-family apartment building was authorized to be constructed on the parcel of land included in this rezoning request (Property Tax Id #31-9-1117-00). The 8-unit multi-family apartment building was never constructed and the parcel of land is currently listed for sale. The zoning requirements for the subject site (The Calumet Street P.D.D. #34-84) are attached. Subject site depicted by green highlight.

On May 18, 1994, Ordinance 61-94 was adopted, which repealed and recreated the Zoning Ordinance. This Zoning Ordinance introduced the Planned Development (PD) Overlay District. As a result, the subject property's zoning classification changed to PD/C-2 Planned Development General Commercial District #34-84.

On June 2, 2004, Ordinance 74-04 was adopted, which repealed and recreated the Zoning Ordinance that is currently in place. This Zoning Ordinance included a section on transition rules. Section 23-35(c) states, "Planned development districts in force at the time of adoption of this ordinance shall continue to be controlled under the standards of the existing planned development district until rezoned by Common Council. However, processes for approving or amending adopted final development plans, plats, certified survey maps, or site plans, shall follow the procedures of this ordinance."

STAFF ANALYSIS

Existing Site Conditions: The subject site is approximately 34,243 square feet in size and is located at the east end of Coolidge Court on the southside of the street. No structures exist on the site.

Surrounding Zoning Classification and Land Uses:

North: PD/C-2 Planned Development General Commercial District #34-84. The adjacent land uses to the north are currently a mix of commercial uses.

South: R-3 Multi-Family District. The adjacent land uses to the south are currently multi-family residential.

East: PD/C-2 Planned Development General Commercial District #34-84. The adjacent land uses to the east are currently a mix of commercial uses.

West: R-1B Single-Family District. The adjacent land uses to the west are currently single-family residential.

Proposed Zoning Classification: The purpose of the R-3 Multi-Family District is to provide for and maintain residential areas characterized by multiple family dwellings, while maintaining the basic qualities of a dense residential neighborhood, which may include other housing types and institutional and limited non-residential uses. The development standards for multi-family dwellings in R-3 District are listed below:

1. **Minimum lot area, multi-family dwellings:** One thousand five-hundred (1,500) square feet per dwelling unit.
2. **Minimum lot width:** Eighty (80) feet.

3. **Minimum front lot line setback:** Twenty (20) feet (twenty-five (25) feet minimum on arterial street).
4. **Minimum rear lot line setback:** Thirty-five (35) feet.
5. **Minimum side lot line setback:** Twenty (20) feet.
6. **Minimum distance between multi-family buildings:** Twelve (12) feet.
7. **Maximum lot coverage:** Seventy percent (70%).
8. **Maximum height:** Forty-five (45) feet.

Appleton Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030: The City of Appleton 2010-2030 Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map identifies the subject area as future Multi-family residential designation. The proposed R-3 Multi-family District rezoning is consistent with the Future Land Use Map. Listed below are related excerpts from the City's *Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030*.

Goal 1 – Community Growth

Appleton will continue to provide opportunities for residential, commercial, and industrial growth, including appropriate redevelopment sites within the downtown and existing neighborhoods and greenfield development sites at the City's edge.

Goal 3 – Housing Quality, Variety, and Affordability

Appleton will provide a variety of rental and ownership housing choices in a range of prices affordable to community residents, and ensure that existing housing is adequately maintained in terms of physical quality and market viability.

OBJECTIVE 5.3 Housing and Neighborhoods:

Provide a range of housing options that meet the needs and appeal to all segments of the community and allows residents to age in place.

Policy 5.3.3 Plan for a supply of developable land suitable for residential development.

OBJECTIVE 7.1 Utilities and Community Facilities:

Provide a pattern of development that minimizes impacts to municipal services and utilities.

OBJECTIVE 10.1 Land Use:

Provide an adequate supply of suitable land meeting the demand for development of various land uses.

Standards for Zoning Map Amendments: Per Section 23-65(d)(3) of the Municipal Code, all recommendations for Official Zoning Map amendments shall be consistent with the adopted plans, goals, and policies of the City and with the intent of the Zoning Ordinance. It would appear the criteria established by Section 23-65(d)(3) Zoning Amendments has been satisfied.

- a. Prior to making a recommendation on a proposed rezoning, the Plan Commission shall make a finding to determine if the following conditions exist. No rezoning of land shall be approved prior to finding at least one of the following:
 1. The request for a zone change is in conformance with the Comprehensive Plan for the City of Appleton. *The rezoning request is in conformance with the Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030, as the Future Land Use Map identifies this area for future multi-family residential uses.*
 2. A study submitted by the applicant that indicates that there has been an increase in the demand for land in the requested zoning district, and as a result, the supply of land within the City mapped as such on the Official Zoning Map, is inadequate to meet the demands for such development.
 3. Proposed amendments cannot be accommodated by sites already zoned in the City due to lack of transportation, utilities or other development constraints, or the market to be served by the proposed use cannot be effectively served by the location of the existing zoning district(s).
 4. There is an error in the code text or zoning map as enacted.
- b. In addition to the findings required to be made by subsection (a), findings shall be made by the Plan Commission on each of the following matters based on the evidence presented:
 1. The adequacy of public facilities such as transportation, utilities and other required public services to serve the proposed site. *This area of the City is served by existing infrastructure, and the transportation network should adequate to serve the subject site.*
 2. The effect of the proposed rezoning on surrounding uses. *A mix of Single-family, Multi-family and Commercial uses are already present in this area of City. The current development standards for the R-3 District, including minimum setbacks, would create some separation from the adjacent uses. Therefore, the proposed rezoning request is unlikely to create adverse impacts in the surrounding neighborhood.*

Technical Review Group (TRG) Report: This item appeared on the June 1, 2021 TRG Agenda. No negative comments were received from participating departments.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends, based upon the standards for zoning map amendments as required by Section 23-65(d)(3) of the Zoning Ordinance, that Rezoning Application #8-21 to rezone the subject site located at Coolidge Court (Property Tax Id #31-9-1117-00) from PD/C-2 Planned Development General Commercial District #34-84 to R-3 Multi-Family District, including the adjacent right-of-way and as shown on the attached map, **BE APPROVED**.
