EMS Flex Grant

Issued: June 13, 2022

1.0 GENERAL INFORMATION

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) serve as the backbone to emergency care, with 791 Wisconsin-based EMS Services, and over 16,000 licensed providers providing pre-hospital emergency medical care statewide. Wisconsin has a robust volunteer model, with over 450 EMS Services being solely volunteer, or operating with a combination of volunteers and parttime/full-time staff. It is no secret that COVID-19 has exposed the EMS system to its greatest challenge yet.

As a group, EMS Services in Wisconsin have been impacted by the economic disruption resulting from and exacerbated by the COVID-19 public health emergency. The EMS system was stretched to the brink before the pandemic. EMS staff serve our state's most vulnerable residents, including work on the very front lines of the COVID-19 pandemic. Positioned at the intersection of public health and public safety, Emergency Medical Services serve our communities 24 hours a day, seven days a week. From stroke to trauma to heart attack to COVID-19, EMS and fire agencies provide life-sustaining frontline healthcare. EMS agencies of all sizes dipped deeply into scant reserves to protect their staff and their communities from COVID-19. The EMS Flex Grant program was created in response to the need to stabilize mobile healthcare providers by providing this one-time funding to ensure they can continue to respond to emergencies across Wisconsin.

All EMS Services that are licensed in the state of Wisconsin are eligible to submit a request for funding.

1.1 Reasonable Accommodations

2.0 ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

All EMS Services licensed in the state of Wisconsin are eligible to request funding. DHS shall interpret eligibility criteria to align with program objectives and American Recovery Plan Act of 2021 requirements. EMS Services may not be funded for the full amount requested, and may be required to submit a revised budget.

Should additional funding become available, DHS will use the initial requests received to make additional decisions about fund availability to selected agencies or to fund additional agencies that applied but were not funded originally.

Funds must be spent within twelve months of the Notice of Award (with the opportunity for an extension under extenuating circumstances).

EMS Services will be required to submit reports every six months. Templates and report submission details will be provided along with the Notice of Award.

Eligible Costs

- Funds can be requested for reasonable operating expenses for EMS.
- Funds must be used to supplement the existing organizational budget.

Ineligible costs:

- Fire suppression equipment
- Costs funded by 2023 Emergency Medical Services: Funding Assistance Program
- Costs that exceed the budget limits outlined below.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE VEHICLES

• You may request up to \$50,000 for an emergency response vehicle such as an ATV, Snowmobile, or Winter EMS Sled

<u>OR</u>

• You may request up to \$200,000 for an ambulance

TRAINING

- You may request the cost of training that is required to use equipment purchased
- You may request the cost of training required to advance scope of practice
- You may request up to \$15,000 for training

STAFFING

• You may request up to \$50,000 to enhance recruitment and retention

Application forms are due to DHS no later than 4:00 p.m. CDT on July 11, 2022. Late forms will not be accepted. Submitters will receive email confirmation of receipt by DHS.

The form will be available in your Service E-Licensing account.

- <u>NEED Statement:</u> The intent of this funding opportunity is to stabilize mobile healthcare providers by providing this one-time funding to support emergency responses across Wisconsin. Please describe what you need funds for, and how these funds will support your ability to continue to respond to emergencies. Suggested word count for the narrative is approximately 300-400 words.
- Equity: (checkbox: yes or no) Projects that are focused on serving geographic or demographic communities in a Qualified Census Tracts will receive stronger consideration.
