Thank you, Mayor. I just want to take a moment to thank staff and your office for recognizing the conversations, the really deep conversations we had over the past—it's been a number of years now but particularly this last cycle—about the importance of trying to do something with this space to to get it back to a little bit more of a semblance of a monument and reflection space for veterans. And I'm incredibly happy to see that we're going to codify this into the comprehensive plan. That gives the nonprofits that have been thinking about working or are working on doing some fundraising to partner with the city to to make this thing happen a baseline, and now they can say we have this project basically set up in the comp plan and we can move forward now with some of these fundraising endeavors. So very pleased to see this and again, commend staff. I have just one question on the language of the update. And that is the second bullet point which says "maintain street parking to support a variety of businesses and public ingress egress to area." My understanding of that language is it's open enough to allow for some change in the parking that's in that space. But I'd just like to hear from staff about that particular definition of "maintain street parking" and what that means for future development.
