Moving on to action items. 22-1437 request to approve the preliminary 2023-2024 Community Development Block Grants community partner funding allocation recommendations as specified in the attached document.

I don't need to push it. All right. So we came last month to get the staff budget, internal budget approved for the grants as well as some internal admin and contracts. So now we just need to get the preliminary community partner applications allocations approved.

So there were nine total applications submitted. And those were sent to you in your packets. There were quite a bit seeking public service. Unfortunately, due to our 15% cap, we were only able to allocate a total of \$88,417 to programming and services, resulting in only four out of the six applications being funded. And then there were an additional three non public service organizations that were funded with their proposed budget. So with that, I would seek approval on the preliminary allocations by the CDBG advisory board.

This year alone, we've made 884 home modifications and repairs. We're on track to break 1000 this year, which we're really, really proud of. 448 of those modifications or repairs in 53 homes have been just in the city of Appleton itself there. So the the partnership that we have is really making an incredible difference from us. I encourage you all at some point to come on downstairs. We're just in the basement here too, and see all the thank you notes from all the very, very grateful people that we've been helping because of it. And we're just extremely grateful for continuing to partner with you and everything that you do. So thank you for for our continued work together.

Hi, good to see you all. Again. I'm Lisa Strandberg, Executive Director for Pillars. And just here to thank the team for recommending almost \$13,000 in funding for our prevention program. We serve about 300 individuals (and half of those are children) to help them avoid the shelter stay. We operate two shelters and this prevention program is meant to keep folks housed and out of shelter. So Thanks for considering the recommendation.

And so with this allocation this year we're really excited to help over 20 or more--hopefully a lot a lot more small business owners--with getting them some technical assistance in helping them grow their business, be more sustainable, be able to help build this community, and create jobs in this area as well. Good afternoon, everyone. John Weyenberg, CEO of Habitat for Humanity in the Fox Cities. Thanks for allowing me to a couple minutes to speak. I just want to thank you for your past support. Habitat has been very fortunate to be a beneficiary of CDBG funds for a number of years. And we've utilized those funds to provide affordable housing opportunities for families in our community, specifically on the homeownership side. And we partner with the many wonderful agencies behind me and others in the community as well to make sure that we address the affordable housing needs in our community. Those have only grown exponentially in the last few years due to the impacts of Covid, and inflation, and all of those other factors that create challenges for us.

But this specific application is to help us purchase blighted homes in the city of Appleton, or homes that have been neglected over a period of time, rehab those homes and turn them into homeownership opportunities for families in our community. And that's just one piece of the broader program that Habitat offers throughout the Fox Cities. But this is a vital role. Homeownership is such a critical element for families to build equity and break that cycle of poverty. So thank you for your past support.
