Good evening, thank you. I'm Jennifer Stephany. I'm the executive director with Appleton downtown Incorporated. And I appreciate the opportunity to share just a couple of additional comments on the topic of our request for free parking for Small Business Saturday. The Small Business Saturday promotion was developed by American Express to incentivize consumers to shop in locally owned small shops. It is really the heart of downtowns across the country and across the world. And this particular promotion is one that we engage in along with many supporters in our community and Appleton Northside Business Association as well. And the request is really about removing an additional barrier. It's a special request. It's one that we put before—we have put before the Council in past years. And this particular request is about exactly that, removing the barriers to bring folks to downtown Appleton to shop on this very special day of Small Business Saturday. And we appreciate the thoughtfulness and dis—discussion that we've had at the committee meeting on this and hope that we can move forward with the support, and I really appreciate the opportunity. Thank you, chair. This is a difficult one for me because I see the benefits that this particular offering of the city to the businesses in Downtown Appleton as beneficial to them. But I also see that we have some meter bagging policies etc. in the city that haven't necessarily been followed in this regard for this particular request. And, again, that makes it very difficult for me to discern whether this is a good exception to that rule. I believe that I will vote in favor of this today, but I would like us as a Council and as a city to review how moving forward this sort of request will be taken up because there really wasn't any kind of policy to follow in this regard. So, we in this committee meeting—and I wasn't—I'm not on the committee, but I attended—we were sort of trying to fly by the seat of our pants and do what was best for the city and the businesses in the city. I do have a question, however, as to the im—the financial impact to the parking utility. I didn't—I've looked for it, but I didn't find it. I'm sorry. Do we have a figure that is an estimate of the impact of the parking utility by waiving this for a day?

Thank you, mayor. A typical Saturday in November—I average the last five years—is about \$2,300. 2022 stood out; that average was \$3,800.

Okay, so on the high end about less than four grand? I would encourage support of this. It's a great, it's a great thing for the downtown businesses and it encourages people to come down and, and spend money at those businesses that are so vitally important to downtown. Thank you.

Thank you. I also encourage everyone who support this. I was really excited to support the original version, which would have included free ramp parking as well, and through the discussions that committee, certainly we don't want to end up with people trapped in the ramp with a fee that they weren't expecting at the end of the day. So, I look forward to figuring out how we can come up with a solution to that in order to support our small businesses even bigger in future years of Small Business Saturday. Thank you.

Thank you, Chair. I agree with Alder Hartzheim that we do need to have a policy going forward. But in this situation, based on the robust discussion that we had in committee, I think it's important to allow for this to occur this year. And just to clarify, for those who were unable to view the entire video of the committee, what we did decide on doing is not bagging the meters. And so people can still feel free—if they were unaware that there is free parking, they will still be plugging in the meter. And I think that's a good compromise for now. Thank you.

Thank you, Mayor. I'm going to vote to support this mainly—I have a hard time seeing our meter rates really been that big of a determinant to people wanting to shop and our downtown. We have relatively affordable parking. But we do have limits on how long you can park at those meters, and this will lift those limits. So, I'm going to vote in support of this.
