This letter is to notify you that we are in receipt of your application for an Operator's License. The Police Department has conducted a criminal background investigation and has recommended that your application for an Operator's License be denied based upon the statutory qualifications listed in Wisconsin Statues §125.04(5). Unless failure to grant the license would constitute unlawful employment discrimination as defined by Wisconsin Law (See Wisconsin Statutes §111.335), Operator/Bartender License may not be granted to individuals with arrest or conviction records, "habitual law offenders," or individuals convicted of a felony who have not been pardoned.

You have the right to appear before the Safety and Licensing Committee to contest this recommendation. To do so, please contact the City Clerk's Office within 30 days of receipt of this letter in order to be placed on the Agenda of the Safety and Licensing Committee. Failure to contact the City Clerk's Office within 30 days will result in your license being denied. At the time of appeal, you may provide the Safety and Licensing Committee competent evidence of sufficient rehabilitation and fitness to perform the licensed activity.

Regular meetings of the Safety and Licensing Committee take place on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month at 5:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers, 6th floor of City Hall, 100 N Appleton St., Appleton, Wisconsin.

Again, should you choose not to appeal this recommendation, your application will be considered denied and an Operator's License will not be issued.

RE: Police Department's Recommendation for Denial of Kelly Arndt's Bartender

Renewal License Application

Committee Members:

The police department is requesting that the Safety and Licensing Committee recommend to the Common Council to deny Kelly Arndt's application for a bartender renewal license based upon her criminal and / or arrest record, her unpardoned felony conviction(s), and her status as a "habitual law offender."

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §111.335(2)(b) and (3)(a), it is not employment discrimination for a licensing agency to deny an applicant based on an arrest or conviction record where the circumstances of the conviction substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed activity.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §125.04(5)(a)1., no license or permit related to alcohol beverages may be issued to an individual with an arrest or conviction record where the circumstances of the record(s) substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed activity.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §125.04(5)(b), no license or permit related to alcohol beverages may be issued to a "habitual law offender" where the circumstances of the habitual law offenses substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed activity.

Also pursuant to Wis. Stat. §111.335(4)(c), if the licensing agency refuses to license an individual based upon arrest or conviction record, the applicant is allowed an opportunity to show "evidence of rehabilitation and fitness to engage in the licensed activity," *unless the conviction(s) are for "exempt offenses.*" Wis. Stat. §111.335(4)(d) provides the following options that the applicant may produce to conclusively demonstrate their rehabilitation and fitness from a given conviction:

A copy of the local, state, or federal release document; and either

(1) a copy of the relevant department of corrections document showing completion of probation, extended supervision, or parole; or

(2) other evidence that at least one year has elapsed since release from any local, state, or federal correctional institution without subsequent conviction of a crime along with evidence showing compliance with all terms and conditions of probation, extended supervision, or parole.

Additionally, the licensing agency must consider any of the following evidence if presented by the individual:

- (1) Evidence of the nature and seriousness of any offense of which he or she was convicted.
- (2) Evidence of all circumstances relative to the offense, including mitigating circumstances or social conditions surrounding the commission of the offense.
- (3) The age of the individual at the time the offense was committed.
- (4) The length of time that has elapsed since the offense was committed.
- (5) Letters of reference by persons who have been in contact with the individual since the applicant's release from any local, state, or federal correctional institution.
- (6) All other relevant evidence of rehabilitation and present fitness presented.

STATEMENT ON SUBSTANTIAL RELATIONSHIP

As part of any denial of licensing, the police department must determine if crimes are substantially related to the sale of alcohol. During the 2023-2024 fiscal licensing year, Ms. Arndt was arrested and formally charged with the following:

2023CF000224 in Calumet County 9/26/2023

- Possess w/Intent-Cocaine (>15-40 grams), a Class D Felony

2024CF000338 in Outagamie County 4/15/2024

- Bail Jumping, a Class H Felony
- Possession of Cocaine, a criminal Misdemeanor offense

While Ms. Arndt held an Operator/Bartender license during the 2023-2024 fiscal year, she was arrested for cocaine related offenses twice. The first arrest involved a substantial amount of cocaine and pertaining to drug dealing activity. Ms. Arndt was arrested for Possession of Cocaine a few months later and also violated the conditions of her bond by committing a new crime. Additionally, the renewal Operator/Bartender license application clearly instructs the applicant to:

"List any <u>pending</u> charges, citations, tickets, and all convictions since last license application in or out of state. Failure to provide complete answers may result in a denial of your application."

Directly under that section, Ms. Arndt failed to disclose her two recent drug arrests. Ms. Arndt has displayed poor decision-making skills during this last year while she held a City of Appleton Operator/Bartender license. While working at a bar, Ms. Arndt will undoubtedly come into

contact with individuals who are in a vulnerable, intoxicated state. Some of these individuals may suffer from addiction, whether it's to alcohol or drugs. Ms. Arndt must show the ability to make sound decisions when it comes to knowing when to stop serving a patron. Her being arrested twice in the last year for drug possession/drug dealing shows she does not possess the proper decision-making skills to responsibly serve alcohol to members of the public. Also, bars and taverns have frequently been locations where drugs are bought/sold/exchanged based on my experience as a police officer. Given Ms. Arndt's recent troubles with possessing and selling cocaine, granting her an Operator/Bartender license would only increase the likelihood of her reoffending.

Based upon the information provided, it is the Appleton Police Department's opinion that Kelly Arndt's Operator/Bartender's renewal license application be denied.

RE: Operator Licensing Renewal Application of Kelly Arndt

Kelly Arndt has applied for an Operator License and is appealing the initial denial of that application. Below is a summary of the relevant Chapter 125 eligibility requirements and an analysis of their application.

Summary

Insufficient grounds currently exist to conclude that the applicant is statutorily ineligible for the license renewal being sought. Renewal should therefore be granted at this time.

As the applicant's pending criminal matters conclude, it remains possible that the situation will change. If or when sufficient evidence becomes available to demonstrate that the applicant is no longer eligible for the license she currently seeks or then holds, revocation proceedings would be available and appropriate.

§125.04(5) Licensing Requirements

According to §125.04(5)(a)1, in order to be granted a license or permit under Wisconsin Statutes Chapter 125, the applicant may not have an arrest or conviction record. This prohibition is subject to the requirements of various statutes prohibiting certain types of employment discrimination, which will be discussed in relevant part below. These statutes are §111.321, §111.322, §111.335 and §125.12 (1) (b).

§125.04(5)(b) states that "No license or permit related to alcohol beverages may, subject to §111.321, 111.322 and 111.335, be issued under this chapter to any person who has habitually been a law offender *or* has been convicted of a felony unless the person has been duly pardoned."

In summary, §125.04(5) prohibits the issuance of alcohol related licenses under chapter 125 to anybody with an arrest or conviction record, anybody with an unpardoned felony conviction, or

anybody "who has habitually been a law offender," regardless of whether any arrests or convictions exist (see <u>State ex rel. Smith v. City of Oak Creek</u>, 139 Wis. 2d 788, 407 N.W.2d 901 (1987)), unless failing to grant that license would constitute prohibited discrimination.

§125.04(3)(j) – False Application Information

It is a violation of the law to provide false information on an application for any type of alcohol beverage license. §125.04(3)(j) provides that the penalty for any person who knowingly provides materially false information on an application for a license or permit under Chapter 125 may be required to forfeit not more than \$1,000.

A review of the general licensing requirements as well as the bases for revocations, suspensions, and refusals to issue or renew licenses reveals what may be an unexpected fact. The provision of false, misleading, or incomplete information on an alcohol license application does not, in and of itself, provide an independent justification to deny, revoke, or suspend an alcohol beverage license under Chapter 125.

Whether this is intentional or an oversight by the legislature is not known. It is undoubtedly a proper consideration in a retail licensing application decision in situations where the licensing authority has more discretion. However, operator licenses are required by statute to be granted if the applicant is eligible for the license applied for. Absent an undiscovered statutory exclusion that might apply to someone who knowingly provides false information on their operator license application, doing so does not make someone statutorily ineligible for an operator license by itself.

Prohibited Discrimination

§111.321 – Prohibited Bases of Discrimination

Arrest or conviction (among other bases not relevant to consideration here) are not permitted to be used as a basis for employment discrimination by a licensing agency.

§111.335 – Arrest or Conviction Record; Exceptions and Special Cases

§111.335(3)(a)1 states that it is not employment discrimination because of a conviction record to refuse to license an individual where that person has been convicted of "any felony, misdemeanor, or other offense the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular job or licensed activity." In evaluating the existence of a substantial relationship, it is the circumstances that provide the opportunity for criminal behavior, the reaction to responsibility, or the character traits of the applicant that are the proper considerations. It is not relevant whether the applicant has the ability to perform the work to an employer's standards. (See Milwaukee Cnty. v. Lab. & Indus. Rev. Comm'n, 139 Wis. 2d 805, 407 N.W.2d 908 (1987)).

Regarding pending charges, it is considered employment discrimination for a licensing agency to refuse to license an individual or suspend an individual from licensing "solely because the individual is subject to a pending criminal charge." The exception to this general rule is when the circumstances of the charge substantially relate to the circumstances of the licensed activity in question, and the offense is either an exempt offense or a violent crime against a child. (See §111.335(2)(b) and (4)(a)). However, even though the fact of a pending charge may not be the sole basis for denial, this does not appear to prohibit the underlying conduct from being considered, to the extent it can be proved with sufficient evidence.

Each offense must be evaluated under the above criteria for determination of whether or not it is substantially related to the activity for which a license is sought. Any arrest (subject to the above), conviction, or other offense which is substantially related to the licensed activity is to be considered in the licensing decision.

Applicability to Kelly Arndt

Ms. Arndt currently has criminal court matters pending in Calumet County and in Outagamie County. As of this writing, both matters are pending. Neither matter alleges an offense that would be considered exempt. Therefore, the fact that either of these matters are pending is not something which can be properly considered as a sole basis for denial.

The facts leading to an arrest remain a proper consideration when determining if an applicant is someone "who has habitually been a law offender." To be considered a "habitual law offender," one need not be convicted of or even arrested for a crime. Findings of guilt by a court are the typical way in which this is demonstrated, but they are not the only way in which law violations can be shown. The full scope of the evidence in the pending criminal matters is not generally available at this point in Ms. Arndt's proceedings. Whether this impacts the ability to determine someone's status as a "habitual law offender" must be determined on a case-by-case basis.

In at least one of Ms. Arndt's pending matters, a recent change in the procedural posture of the case indicates that there is at least the possibility of additional relevant factual developments before it is concluded. The posture of the cases at the time of Lt. Goodin's memorandum recommending the denial of the application was premised upon the (then) well-founded belief that the applicant was statutorily ineligible in fact, and that this fact could be sufficiently demonstrated to the Committee and Council. The change in the posture of the criminal matters is something that occurred after the original memorandum submitted by Lt. Goodin. It is not something he could have predicted based on the status of the cases at that time. Predictable or not, the change does appear to now preclude a fair and full consideration of the facts at this time.

There is sufficient evidence by which it might be shown that the applicant violated the law by providing materially false information on her renewal application. This does not, by itself, allow for the conclusion that the applicant is a "habitual law offender," or render her statutorily

ineligible for the license applied for. It remains a consideration with respect to future license renewals, new applications, and other eligibility determinations under Chapter 125.

Based on the above, it is premature to conclude whether or not Ms. Arndt is a "habitual law offender" and therefore ineligible for the license applied for. In the absence of a determination that she is a "habitual law offender," Ms. Arndt remains eligible for licensure, at least with respect to that specific qualification.

Conclusion

The defendant's application should be granted, as it cannot be shown that she is ineligible at this time.

The outcome of Ms. Arndt's pending criminal matters remains to be seen both legally and factually. Both could potentially have impacts upon whether Ms. Arndt remains statutorily eligible for an operator's license. The situation can and will be monitored. Changes to eligibility would be addressed in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes §125.12, which governs revocations, suspensions, and refusals to issue or renew alcohol beverage licenses under Chapter 125.

The police department is requesting that the Safety and Licensing Committee recommend to the Common Council to deny Crystal Williams' application for a bartender license.

Wis. Stat §125.04(5)(a)1., does not allow issuance of licenses or permits to those with an arrest or conviction record unless denial would constitute prohibited employment discrimination. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §111.335, it is not employment discrimination for a licensing agency to deny an applicant based on conviction record where the circumstances of the conviction substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed activity.

STATEMENT ON SUBSTANTIAL RELATIONSHIP

Ms. Williams was convicted of Battery (a class A misdemeanor) in Outagamie County case # 2019CM000863. This offense is in violation of Chapter 940 of the Wisconsin Statutes. Additionally, Ms. Williams is on active supervision through the Wisconsin Department of Corrections. One of her rules of probation is "Not possess or consume alcohol." She would be in direct violation of her probation rules if she were to obtain a bartender's license.

The above conviction is for an exempt offense under Wis. Stat. §111.335(1m)(b). Under Wis. Stat. §111.335(4)(c)2., there is no requirement for the licensing agency to state its reasons for denial in writing or to allow the individual an opportunity to show rehabilitation and fitness to engage in the licensed activity.

Ms. Williams does not meet the requirement of Wis. Stat §125.04(5)(a)1. A license or permit related to alcohol beverages consequently may not be issued.

The police department is requesting that the Safety and Licensing Committee recommend to the Common Council to deny Crystal Williams' application for a Bartender license. This document is a supplement report with further information pertaining to Ms. Williams' criminal history.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §111.335(2)(b) and (3)(a), it is not employment discrimination for a licensing agency to deny an applicant based on an arrest or conviction record where the circumstances of the conviction substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed activity.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §125.04(5)(a)1., no license or permit related to alcohol beverages may be issued to an individual with an arrest or conviction record where the circumstances of the record(s) substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed activity.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §125.04(5)(b), no license or permit related to alcohol beverages may be issued to a "habitual law offender" where the circumstances of the habitual law offenses substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed activity.

Also pursuant to Wis. Stat. §111.335(4)(c), if the licensing agency refuses to license an individual based upon arrest or conviction record, the applicant is allowed an opportunity to show "evidence of rehabilitation and fitness to engage in the licensed activity," *unless the conviction(s) are for "exempt offenses.*" Wis. Stat. §111.335(4)(d) provides the following options that the applicant may produce to conclusively demonstrate their rehabilitation and fitness from a given conviction:

A copy of the local, state, or federal release document; and either

- (1) a copy of the relevant department of corrections document showing completion of probation, extended supervision, or parole; or
- (2) other evidence that at least one year has elapsed since release from any local, state, or

federal correctional institution without subsequent conviction of a crime along with evidence showing compliance with all terms and conditions of probation, extended supervision, or parole.

Additionally, the licensing agency must consider any of the following evidence if presented by the individual:

- (1) Evidence of the nature and seriousness of any offense of which he or she was convicted.
- (2) Evidence of all circumstances relative to the offense, including mitigating circumstances or social conditions surrounding the commission of the offense.
- (3) The age of the individual at the time the offense was committed.
- (4) The length of time that has elapsed since the offense was committed.
- (5) Letters of reference by persons who have been in contact with the individual since the applicant's release from any local, state, or federal correctional institution.
- (6) All other relevant evidence of rehabilitation and present fitness presented.

STATEMENT ON SUBSTANTIAL RELATIONSHIP

As noted in my previous denial recommendation letter, Ms. Williams was convicted of Battery in Outagamie County under case # 2019CM000863. Additionally, she pleaded guilty to Battery Due to No Contest Plea in Outagamie County under case # 2021CF000866. Because these convictions are "exempt offenses" under Wis. Stat. §111.335(1m)(b), there is no requirement for the licensing agency to state the substantial relationship between the circumstances of the offenses and the licensed activity in writing, or to allow the individual an opportunity to show rehabilitation and fitness to engage in the licensed activity. Based upon these records alone, Ms. Williams does not meet the statutory eligibility criteria to be granted an operator/bartender license.

Ms. Williams is on probation for case # 2021CF000866 with one of her probation rules stating she shall not possess or consume alcohol. Ms. Williams also was convicted of Possess Open Intoxicants in Motor Vehicle – Driver in Winnebago County case # 2023TR002565.

Based upon the above record and reasoning disqualifying Ms. Williams from license eligibility, it is recommended that her application be denied.

Crystal Williams has applied for an Operator's (Bartender's) License and is appealing the denial of that application. Below is a summary of the relevant Chapter 125 eligibility requirements and an analysis of their application in this case.

Summary / Conclusion

The applicant has been convicted of an "exempt" misdemeanor criminal offense. This conviction is for a misdemeanor with a substantial relationship to the licensed activity. Denial on this basis does not constitute unlawful discrimination. Ms. Williams does not meet the eligibility criteria required by §125.04(5), and therefore may not be granted any license under Chapter 125.

§125.04(5) Licensing Requirements

According to §125.04(5)(a)1, in order to be granted a license or permit under Wisconsin Statutes Chapter 125, the applicant may not have an arrest or conviction record. This prohibition is subject to the requirements of various statutes prohibiting certain types of employment discrimination, which will be discussed below. These statutes are §111.321, §111.322, §111.335 and §125.12 (1) (b).

§125.04(5)(b) states that "No license or permit related to alcohol beverages may, subject to §111.321, 111.322 and 111.335, be issued under this chapter to any person who has habitually been a law offender or has been convicted of a felony unless the person has been duly pardoned."

In summary, §125.04(5) prohibits the issuance of alcohol related licenses under chapter 125 to anybody with an arrest or conviction record, anybody with an unpardoned felony conviction, or anybody "who has habitually been a law offender," regardless of whether any arrests or convictions exist (see State ex rel. Smith v. City of Oak Creek, 139 Wis. 2d 788, 407 N.W.2d 901 (1987)), unless failing to grant that license would constitute prohibited discrimination.

Prohibited Discrimination

§111.322 – Discriminatory Actions Prohibited

§111.322(1) specifies that refusal to license any individual on any of the bases listed in §111.321, which includes arrest and conviction history. This is subject to exceptions set forth in §111.33 to §111.365, neither of which apply to the instant circumstances.

§111.335 – Arrest or Conviction Record; Exceptions and Special Cases

§111.335(3)(a)1 states that it is not employment discrimination because of a conviction record to refuse to license an individual where that person has been convicted of "any felony, misdemeanor, or other offense the circumstances of which substantially related to the circumstances of the particular job or licensed activity." In evaluating the existence of a substantial relationship, it is the circumstances that provide the opportunity for criminal behavior, the reaction to responsibility, or the character traits of the applicant that are the proper considerations. It is not relevant whether the applicant has the ability to perform the work to an employer's standards. (See Milwaukee Cnty. v. Lab. & Indus. Rev. Comm'n, 139 Wis. 2d 805, 407 N.W.2d 908 (1987)).

Each offense must be evaluated under the above criteria for determination of whether or not it is substantially related to the activity for which a license is sought. Any arrest, conviction, or other offense which is substantially related to the licensed activity is to be considered in the licensing decision.

Consideration of Rehabilitation

§111.335(4)(c)1 requires that if a license is denied *based upon §111.335(3)(a)1* (as discussed in the preceding section), the licensing agency *typically* has two further obligations. It must state the reasons for denial in writing, including a statement of how the circumstances of the offense(s) relate to the licensed activity. It must also allow the person to show evidence of rehabilitation.

Exempt Offenses

"Exempt Offenses" are defined by §111.335(1m)(b). Exempt offenses are those specified in Chapter 940 or §948.02, 948.025, 948.03, 948.05, 948.051, 948.055, 948.06, 948.07, 948.075, 948.08, 948.085, or 948.095, or a violation of the law of another jurisdiction that would be a violation of one of the listed statutes if committed in Wisconsin.

§111.335(4)(c)2 indicates that the considerations of rehabilitation and the requirement to state the reasons for denial based upon §111.335(3)(a)1, including the substantial relationship, do not

apply to an "exempt offense." The allowance for demonstration of rehabilitation is only provided for by §111.335(4)(c)1.b, which does not apply to "exempt offenses." Where a particular offense is considered "exempt," its consideration stops at the existence of a "substantial relationship," and does not progress to rehabilitation.

Chapter 940 offenses are crimes against life and bodily security. Homicide offenses, sexual offenses, various forms of battery and other more general violent offenses are contained within Chapter 940. Any offense in Chapter 940 is considered "exempt." While it is true that a licensing agency is statutorily much more restricted in how it may consider "exempt offenses," those restrictions are reserved for a limited class of criminal offenses.

Applicability to Crystal Williams

According to the information gathered by the Appleton Police Department, Ms. Williams was convicted of Battery, a class A misdemeanor offense, contrary to §940.19. This conviction occurred in Outagamie County case 19CM863 on 2/26/2020. As a Chapter 940 offense, this offense is considered "exempt." It is not subject to the requirement that the applicant be permitted to demonstrate rehabilitation. It is not subject to the requirement that a written explanation of the "substantial relationship" be provided.

Conclusion

The applicant has been convicted of an "exempt" misdemeanor criminal offense. This conviction is for a misdemeanor with a substantial relationship to the licensed activity. Denial on this basis does not constitute unlawful discrimination. Ms. Williams does not meet the eligibility criteria required by §125.04(5), and therefore may not be granted any license under Chapter 125.

¹ It is the advice of Legal Services that a substantial relationship must still exist between the circumstances of the offense and licensed activity, even though the licensing agency is statutorily relieved from documenting its nature in writing.

COMPLAINT SEEKING REVOCATION OF ALCOHOL LICENSES OF BT AND DAVE, LLC

Complainant seeks that the Safety and Licensing Committee of the Common Council of the City of Appleton meet as soon as practicable and as allowed by law, at which time the Complainant, Appleton Police Department Captain Gary Lewis, a resident of the City of Appleton, will ask the Committee to find this complaint to be true and recommend to the common Council that it REVOKE the alcohol beverage licenses of BT and Dave, LLC.

BT and Dave, LLC has registered agent of Theodore Suess and was issued Class "B" (beer) and "Class B" (liquor) licenses of the premises located at 425 W. College Avenue, Appleton, Wisconsin 54911, known as Speakeasy Ultra Lounge.

This complaint by Gary Lewis is being made based upon information and belief regarding the incident described herein:

On March 3, 2023, Appleton Police Department Officer Kyle Jakobsen reports that he was on patrol in the area of N. Division Street and W. College Avenue during the overnight hours. At approximately 1:05 AM, his attention was drawn to a possible disturbance near the Speakeasy Ultra

Lounge, located at 425 W. College Avenue. There appeared to be a physical altercation occurring on the sidewalk amongst several adult individuals.

As officers approached, the involved parties began dispersing in both directions on the sidewalk and also into Speakeasy. They made contact with Dontonio Wells and Steven Wells. Dontonio identified himself as the manager of the bar, and Steven identified himself as the bouncer. Dontonio indicated that a fight had occurred in the bar and Steven attempted to escort a patron out of the bar.

Steven showed officers a recent abrasion to his right brow. Steven indicated he had been hit in the face while escorting a patron out of the bar. He indicated he did not want charges to be filed and that he would handle the situation on his own. He did not want to provide a statement and he left the scene while appearing to remain angry and volatile.

Officers were subsequently able to make contact with the patron that was kicked out of Speakeasy when, a short time later, officers heard Steven Wells yelling loudly from near a different nearby bar that officers had ten seconds to respond, or he (Steven) was going to "kill him." Officers and Dontonio were able to remove Steven from the area and make contact with the subject identified in the subsequent criminal complaint as TRPK. TRPK had a large abrasion and significant swelling on his left eye socket and brow.

Once calmed down and removed a safe distance from the scene, TRPK indicated that he had been at Speakeasy when a fight erupted behind him. He tried to break up the fight when he was wrapped up in someone's arms from behind and dragged towards the door of the bar. He tried to resist and swung his elbows toward the back of his head at the person who had him wrapped up from behind.

Once outside, he indicated he was attacked by several people which led to him being face down on the sidewalk. While face down on the sidewalk, he was kicked in the face. Shortly thereafter, the police arrived and he went into a nearby bar to seek medical attention.

Officer Jakobsen was able to obtain exterior traffic camera video of the area where the confrontation occurred. He observed several adult male subjects dragging TRPK out of Speakeasy. One of the males dragging TRPK was identified as Steven Wells by his distinctive clothing. TRPK ended up on face down on the sidewalk. Officer Jakobsen observed that TRPK was clearly not posing any threat and was not fighting. With TRPK in that position, he observed Steven Wells kick TRPK in the side of the face. TRPK's head jolted to the right. Seconds later, the video showed police lights, and all the involved individuals other than TRPK fled moments prior to officers' arrival.

On March 10, 2023, Off. Jakobsen attempted to contact Dontonio Wells via telephone and voicemail without success. He then attempted to make contact with him in person at Speakeasy later that evening. After making contact with employees at the bar, he asked to speak with Dontonio. An employee walked to the rear of the bar, returning several minutes later. The employee relayed that Dontonio was using the restroom but would be out shortly. Off. Jakobsen asked the employee to have him come outside so they could speak by the front entrance of the establishment. After waiting outside for an extended period of time, Off. Jakobsen came to understand that Dontonio was declining to speak with him.

As a result of the above, Steven Wells was charged with Battery, contrary to §940.19(1) of the Wisconsin Statutes, in Outagamie County case 23CM942. On May 20, 2024, Steven Wells entered a "No Contest" plea and was found guilty of the offense of Battery by Judge Mark McGinnis.

According to §9-54 of the Municipal Code of the City of Appleton, the above-described events constitute a violation of Wisconsin Statutes and City of Appleton Ordinances classified as "Other acts – failure to maintain order / disorderly conduct, noise complaints, etc." There exists a substantial relationship between the violations and the licensed activity. Such violations are to be assessed 45 demerit points against retail alcohol licenses.

Additionally, because the violation resulted in bodily harm to an individual and / or created a substantial risk of death or bodily harm, the above is considered a "severe offense." Therefore 100 additional demerit points are to be assessed.

Pursuant to Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes and the courts' interpretations thereof, the licensee BT and Dave, LLC, is answerable for the above describe acts. Therefore 145 demerit points should be attributed to its license as a result of the conviction arising from the events described above.

Having previously been assessed 150 demerit points on or about August 16, 2023 (Action Item 23-0982), the licensee has accumulated no fewer than 295 demerit points during the past 36 months.

Recommendation and Conclusion

The above information indicates that state and / or local laws were violated by the licensee, or by its agents or employees working at the licensed premises. Complainant requests that the Safety and Licensing Committee impose 145 demerit points for the above violation. Based upon this accumulation of demerit points and based upon the Municipal Code of the City of Appleton Sec. 9-54(d)(3), that the retail alcohol beverage licenses be revoked, as a result of the accumulation of 200 or more demerit points within a 36-month period. Upon an assessment of the demerit points, and in light of the substantial relationship between the violations and the licensed activity, this complaint is requesting that the Safety and Licensing Committee recommend to the Common Council that it REVOKE the licenses issued to BT and Dave, LLC, (agent: Theodore Suess) for the licensed premises known as Speakeasy Ultra Lounge, located at 425 W. Wisconsin Avenue, Appleton, Wisconsin.

STIPULATION

The City of Appleton, by Assistant City Attorney Zak Buruin and BT and Dave, LLC by its agent Theodore Suess, hereby stipulate and agree as follows:

- BT and Dave, LLC and agent Theodore Suess are the licensees of "Class B" and Class "B" licenses issued pursuant to Chapter 125, Wisconsin Statutes, and Appleton City Ordinances ("ACO") in conformity therewith, for the licensed Premises known as Speakeasy Ultra Lounge, located at 425 W. College Ave, in the City of Appleton, Outagamie County, Wisconsin.
- 2. A violation of ACO was committed at the licensed establishment on October 1, 2022; to wit, a violation of ACO 9-82 prohibiting Improper Exhibitions in Outagamie County case 23FO422. The date of conviction for this offense is June 30, 2023. As part of the stipulated resolution of this citation, the parties agreed that the violation involved a "Nude or semi-nude entertainer / employee on premises," contrary to ACO 9-54. One hundred fifty (150) demerit points are associated with this violation.
- 3. The parties agreed as part of the negotiated settlement of the citation that this violation subjects the establishment to suspension of its alcoholic beverage license(s) per ACO as adopted pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes §125.10.
- 4. The above conviction is substantially related to the licensed activities.
- 5. A Complaint Seeking Suspension of Alcohol Licenses of BT and Dave, LLC was filed with the City of Appleton Clerk's Office on August 9, 2023.

- 6. The Summons and a copy of said Complaint was served on Theodore Suess as agent of BT and Dave LLC, requiring their appearance at the Safety and Licensing Committee on August 9, 2023, to show cause as to why their licenses should not be suspended or revoked.
- 7. Theodore Suess understands and acknowledges the right to a hearing prior to the City of Appleton Suspending or revoking any licenses issued and freely and voluntarily waives the right to a hearing as consideration for this agreement.

- 11. The suspension shall commence on August 14, 2023, and end on August 23, 2023 (inclusive). The commencement of this suspension shall, upon the approval of the Appleton Common Council, be retroactive to the date of August 14, 2023 so that the effect will be 10 calendar days during which the licensed establishment is ceasing from engaging in licensed activity.

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



GRAFTON — A proposal for a gaming lounge bar in downtown Grafton stalled this week, as the Plan Commission tabled the conditional use permit the business will require in order to obtain more information.

David Boulanger submitted an application for the conditional use permit to the Plan Commission, which met Tuesday. Boulanger said the proposed business for 1208 12th Ave., the former location of Lash Boutique in the commercial complex at the corner of 12th Avenue and Washington Street, would be a small establishment called Bella's Gaming Lounge, serving beer and bar snacks.

The plan included several television sets for sports game viewing and five bar gaming machines. According to Boulanger, the bar would have only 10 to 15 patrons at a time on the high end; there would be limited seating under the business plan, and he said the business would not produce high levels of noise, as it would be a quiet place to lounge, relax and play games rather than a traditional bar.

The permit application was tabled after a public hearing and Plan Commission discussion, during which there were concerns about noise, gambling on the bar video games and whether such an establishment fit the character of what the village of Grafton envisioned for downtown.

Village President and Plan Commission Jim Brunnquell asked Boulanger about patrons being able to win money at the game machines, noting some bars have that type of machine. Boulanger said there are machines like that, but gave no specific information about what games or type of games he planned to use in Bella's Gaming Lounge, beyond that they would be coin-operated machines.

"It's just going to be just like what you'll see in other bars in the area, that's the best I can tell you," Boulanger said.

Several other Plan Commissioners inquired about the specific games as well, and expressed concerns about gambling and the business's hours. The permit application indicated hours of opening at 8 a.m. daily and closing at 12 a.m. or 2 a.m., though Boulanger said he planned to close by midnight daily.

"To have it open at 8 a.m. when you're serving primarily alcohol ... I think that could potentially be an issue," Plan Commissioner Brittany Hess said.

The village's Community Development Director Jessica Wolff noted in discussion that the state has limitations on the actions a commission can take when a conditional use is listed for a district within the zoning code.

"If I could remind the Plan Commission, bars are a conditional use in the downtown. There has to be very specific grounds for denying a condition use under state statute, legally," she said.

The Plan Commission tabled the matter to next month's meeting, and directed Wolff to gather additional information about potential impacts of the planned business and consult the village's legal counsel for information about the process and application.

During the public hearing on the permit, Jeff and Julie Prochnow spoke against the planned business, The Prochnows recently received village approval to convert space above the bar's proposed location into tourist rooming houses; their concern was that a bar downstairs would cause noise and disruption to their business and others in the building, as they said the building's design was not very soundproof.

"I'm not a fan of the use, given the other uses in there," Plan Commissioner Mark Paschke said.

Jeremy Hahn, a resident of West Bend, spoke in favor of Bella's Gaming Lounge during the hearing. He said the lounge bar business model would cause noise only similar to what other area businesses create, and not greater noise.

"This is the commerce district. Downtowns are more noisy," Hahn said.

STATEMENT OF PUBLIC NOTICE

The purpose of the public hearing is to review and comment on a request by Food Dog LLC for a conditional use permit for an embroidery facility (Light Industrial) known at World Emblem International at 1000 Hickory Street

Statement of public notice was given by Administrative Assistant Sara Young.

Community Development Director Jessica Wolff gave a summary on the conditional use permit request. She stated that the applicant is requesting a conditional use permit at the former Control Products facility. The business would occupy 36,200 square feet and offer embroidery services for garments and other marketing materials. The World Emblem has facilities in Texas, Illinois, Georgia, California, and Canada. The floor plan includes embroidery equipment, warehousing, shipping area, offices, and restrooms. The purpose of the public hearing is to review and comment on a request by Alan and Rebecca Goldman to rezone land located on Hunter's Lane (Parcel 10-019-13-005.00) from MF-14 Multi-Family Residential-14 to I Institutional

Statement of public notice was given by Administrative Assistant Young. Director Wolff stated that the applicant is requesting that their property on Hunter's Lane west of Port Washington Road be rezoned from MF-14 Multi-Family Residential-14 to I Institutional to accommodate the proposed institutional residential facility known as Woodside Prairie. The project previously obtained conditional use permit and site plan approval from the Plan Commission however, this approval has expired since no activity took place. Director Wolff noted that this development will be considered an "Institutional Residential Facility" under the Zoning Ordinance because no State licenses for care of adults (i.e., CBRF) She stated that she had been informed of a change to the proposed usage and would now need to address the zoning to meet the projects new proposed intent. She has received no public input on the project so far.

Mr. Paschke explained that the facility would have general housing managers rather than student managers.

Mrs. Goldman provided background on the intent of the project and explained that they want a community with a variety of residents not just autistic adults.

She noted that this item was tabled at the February meeting. The main concerns are noise, level of activity, and "fit" in the downtown area. Director Wolff stated that she is recommending changes in the hours of operation to 11:00 a.m. to midnight daily and having no sound on any gaming machines. She recently worked with the applicant and the Prochnows on the second floor on sound testing and found no concerns for sound in the bar area.

Johnathon Woodward, Village Attorney, gave an overview of the legal opinion regarding the gaming machines. Video gaming machines where there is cash payout, and where the business owner receives compensation, are unlawful and considered gambling, which is illegal in the state of Wisconsin.

Director Wolff received two public comments opposed to the project from Mike Bowen at 1121 13th Avenue and Jay Jorgenson at 2721 First Avenue.

David and Courtney Boulanger were present to answer any questions or concerns. Chair Brunnquell opened the public hearing.

David Boulanger, 1024 Sumac Dr, West Bend, WI 53090.

Mr. Boulanger requested that condition #4 be changed to allow low sound on the gaming machines since it was determined that sound is not a problem. He also requested to remove condition #5 because the Department of Revenue says the machines have to pay out.

Laura Kacmarcik, 1000 Badger Circle.

Mrs. Kacmarcik is concerned that this type of use does not belong downtown. They will use the Air BnBs for visitors and she does not think it will be safe. She is also concerned about impact on high school students and parking.

Dan Delorit, 772 Overland Court.

Trustee Delorit asked if this business was part of a chain and stated that his constituents had public safety concerns with the proposed operation. Mrs. Boulanger confirmed the business is not part of a chain and that they would have a Coin Operator License.

Courtney Boulanger, 1024 Sumac Dr, West Bend, WI 53090.

Mrs. Boulanger noted that the gaming lounge is for watching sports. They filled out the amusement license as required and wants equal protection similar to other bars.

Commissioner Paschke noted that the State statute for gaming machines does not allow the customer to receive a monetary gain.

Commissioner Hamm noted her concern for public health and additional implications with the gaming machines related to addiction, women, and the elderly. The logarithms used by these types of machines are designed to make users become addicted to variable reinforcement based on extended use and increased wagering. She does not believe this type of operation would be in accordance with Village Code or legal under Village Ordinance.

Chair Brunnquell asked Mr. Boulanger if he would be willing to move forward with the conditions, including updating item #5 to include no cash payouts from the gaming machines, to bring the proposal into legal compliance; Mr. Boulanger declined.

There were no more comments or concerns. Chair Brunnquell closed the public hearing and proposed the motion to deny the request based on the illegality of gambling per State of Wisconsin Statute and Village Ordinance.

Consideration on the conditional use permit requested by David Boulanger for a bar at 1208 12th Avenue

Motion by Commissioner Paschke, seconded by Commissioner Kletti, to deny a conditional use permit for a bar and gaming lounge at 1208 12th Avenue. Motion carried.

Review and consideration of a site plan for a food truck site known as Grafton Station at 1020 Washington Street

The Village was approached by a food truck vendor about using the former Clark gas station site for his business. The original plan for the Clark site was to work with the property owner to the north to combine the two properties for a mixed use redevelopment project. Unfortunately, the property owner has indicated to staff that they are not in a position to move forward in the near future. As such, staff is expanding on the food truck idea to create a Village-run food truck site.

The site plan includes paving the majority of the site and creating a one-way traffic flow (entry on Washington Street and exit on 11th Avenue), a seating area, two spaces for food trucks/trailers, bike racks, and parking. Electrical service would also need to be reestablished so that food trucks do not need to use generators which can be noisy. Staff hopes to have the site open in June.

Commissioner Kletti inquired if there would be restrooms on site. Director Wolff responded that none would be needed. Commissioner Harms asked if users would need permits from the Village to use the space. Director Wolff responded yes, and that staff is working on an application.

Chair Brunnquell stated that this project had been discussed at the Finance Committee meeting and that this was just a Site Plan consideration to clean up a Village owned site.

Motion by Commissioner Harms, seconded by Commissioner Paschke, to approve a site plan for food truck site at 1020 Washington Street, as presented. Motion carried.

The village of Grafton Plan Commission met last week, and reconsidered a conditional use permit application from David Boulanger for Bella's Gaming Lounge; he originally came to the commission in February, planning a bar that would serve beer and bar snacks, with several television sets for sports game viewing in the bar and five coin-operated gaming machines.

Boulanger planned the new business for 1208 12th Ave., the former location of Lash Boutique in the commercial complex at the corner of 12th Avenue and Washington Street. The matter was tabled last month for further information due to concerns about gambling on the coin-operated game machines, noise disrupting neighboring businesses and the proposed hours of a drinking establishment opening at 8 a.m.

While some concerns were addressed between the February meetings — he agreed to limit his hours to 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. instead of 8 a.m. to midnight, and sound tests found most normal noise from the space did not disrupt neighbors — village information stated Boulanger had also decided to pursue a full liquor license, instead of just beer licensing.

Boulanger said he intended on using the game machines and that they would have payouts of some kind where customers could win money or value.

"Essentially, under Wisconsin law, any device that provides value in a game of chance is considered illegal under Wisconsin statutes and village ordinance," attorney Jonathan Woodward said during last week's Plan Commission meeting.

Planning staff's report on the conditional use permit included a recommendation that Boulanger be required to not have payouts from the gamin machines. Boulanger did not agree to that condition, at which point the Plan Commission denied the permit application.

There was some discussion on the machines. Boulanger said the state department of revenue required the bar game machines to have cash payouts. He said also that there were other establishments in Grafton that used the gambling machines, and asked why the village had gaming licenses if it was illegal.

Community Development Director Jessica Wolff clarified that the village had amusement licenses for coin-operated video games machines; the license is for all pay-to-play video games, some of which do not involve gambling and payouts.

Woodward and Village President Jim Brunnquell said whether there may be similar machines in other places in the village was also irrelevant. The Plan Commission was considering Boulanger's application for Bella's Gaming Lounge, which included gaming machines that were for gambling purposes, according to legal definition.

"You're asking us to authorize what our attorney said is an illegal practice," Brunnquell.

According to the legal opinion given to the village, Wisconsin statute states anyone who "Permits any real estate owned or occupied by him or her or under his or her control to be used as a gambling place," or "permits a gambling machine to be set up for use for the purpose of gambling in a place under his or her control," is guilty of a misdemeanor or violation of law.

Michael Herbrand and Bennett Jenkins of Houseman and Feind sent the opinion.

On 10/16/24 I received email correspondence from City of Appleton attorney Zak Buruin. Attorney Buruin informed me a new bar attempting to open at 823 W. College Ave. known as Delaire's initially had their alcohol license approved by the Safety and Licensing committee. On the licensing application, Delaire's is reportedly going to be a coffee bar and a traditional bar serving alcoholic beverages. However, Alderperson Van Zeeland received reports from her constituents that Delaire's actually planned on using the business as a gambling parlor. The City Council sent the alcohol license application back to the Safety and Licensing committee to review based on this information. Attorney Buruin informed me the owner of Delaire's, David Boulanger, previously tried opening a bar with gaming machines in Grafton, WI in 2022 but was denied by Grafton's planning commission.

On 10/23/24 Alderperson Van Zeeland e-mailed me contact information for the main complainant about Delaire's, identified as Jaime Pappenfuss. Jaime runs a salon directly next door to Delaire's. On 10/24/24 I spoke with Jaime over the phone to get her statement. Jaime stated someone gave a person from Delaire's a key to access her business (they have a joint rear hallway within the building) to look for some sort of electrical hook up. Jaime was at her salon when this occurred. Jaime spoke with the male who came over and asked if there was going to be a coffee bar in the establishment and the male said "yeah, well not really one with drinks but more of a gambling machine lounge." Jaime informed me she did an internet search and discovered David's past encounter in Grafton. Jaime then forwarded this information to Alderperson Van Zeeland.

Jaime stated the above-mentioned comment about the business being a gambling machine lounge was captured on her salon cameras. Jaime sent me the video clip in question which I saved to evidence.com. The video shows Jaime asking an unidentified white male what was going in the business next door. The male responded, "A bar but not really (unintelligible) gambling machines". There was some background noise while the male was speaking, and I couldn't make

out all of his words. Jaime then laughed and asked, "like Big Daddy and all that?" and the male said "yeah". After viewing the video and comparing the side view of the male's face with David's DOT photo it does not appear that David is the one on video. The video was recorded on 10/15/24 at 2:33 pm according to the time stamp on the footage.

After speaking with Jaime, I went by Delaire's and viewed the interior of the bar from the storefront window. The business had a small bar area, several high back seats with tables, and a small couch seating area. There were no gambling machines visible at that time.

Later on 10/24/24 I spoke on the phone with Timm Gloudemans, who works for Buss Electric Inc. Timm was the electrical inspector hired by Delaire's to complete the electrical permit for the business. I asked Timm if there was anything unusual about his time in Delaire's or anything from an electrical wiring standpoint and he said no. Timm advised the inspection was pretty standard and nothing suspicious occurred. Timm did not know anything about gambling machines being installed at the business.

I attempted to speak with the owner of Amberlulu Bubble Tea and Desserts (Uni Uni) which is the business on the other side of Delaire's. I went by Uni Uni on 11/6/24 and spoke with the manager, who called and messaged the owner Fannie, but she did not respond. I left the manager my business card and asked her to have Fannie call me. I called Fannie and left her a voicemail and have yet to receive a call back. Jaime indicated Fannie may have more information about the gambling machine allegations which is why I reached out to her.

Jaime also gave me a phone number for the landlord of the property, identified as Jeff. I called Jeff on 11/16/24 and left a voicemail asking him to call me back.

On 11/16/24 I spoke with David over the phone to get his statement. I told David I had received complaints that his new business was going to operate as a gambling parlor instead of a bar. David stated he had no intentions of running any sort of gambling operation and was opening the business as a bar just as he indicated on his alcohol license application. I told David about the video Jaime sent me and he stated he had no idea who she spoke with that made that comment on the video. David said he did not plan on having any sort of gambling machines at all. He said in the future he may install some amusement devices that do not pay out any money but that's it.

As of 11/26/24 I have not developed any other leads to investigate this complaint.

The Police Department has been allocated \$66,000 from ARPA funds for the purpose of getting our officers into Load Bearing Vests with Ballistic Rifle Plate capabilities. The expiration of our current Ballistic Rifle Plate system and the changeover from the standard uniform has created the need for this system.

Currently officers are issued Soft Body Armor (bulletproof vests) in a 5-year rotating cycle. We have used Armor Express brand vests for the last 8 years, with Nelson Tactical as our vender. Due to the exact nature in which each individual vest is measured, and the copyrighted style that each brand works under, it is a necessity that we stay with Armor Express vests to allow this transition to work.

The Armor Express Raven 2.0 is what we are transitioning to. New officers in 2025 and those that are up in the rotation cycle will be put in this vest and issued a Ballistic Rifle Plate. The rest of the officers would be offered the "Bravo" cut version of the Raven 2.0, which would work in conjunction with their current soft body armor.

Subject: Request Approval to Purchase Cardiac Monitors

This past November, the City of Appleton Common Council ratified the 2025 Budget and Service Plan. The 2025 budget included capital funding for advanced life support (ALS) cardiac monitors. This critical life-saving equipment is the cornerstone of our medical service level upgrade to paramedic in 2025.

The primary benefit of this project is the community will receive a significantly reduced time between incident dispatch and ALS intervention. The Appleton Fire Department (AFD) will be able to provide skills like advanced airways, medication administration for pain management, respiratory distress, and cardiac emergencies prior to the arrival of an ambulance.

Members of the AFD Cardiac Monitor Committee participated in vendor presentations, product demonstrations, hands-on application, and extensive research to develop a specification that will meet the needs of our community. On October 22, 2024, a request for quotes (RFQ) was sent out. Vendor quotes were due November 20, 2024. We had three vendors submit a sealed quote. The sealed quotes were disseminated to the AFD Cardiac Monitor Committee to be independently scored. After the scoring was complete, the committee unanimously selected the LIFEPAK 35 as the preferred cardiac monitor. A copy of the complied scoring criteria is attached.

The AFD is requesting approval to purchase the LIFEPAK 35 cardiac monitor through Stryker Sales, LLC after January 1, 2025.


