### Original Narrative

**11/03/2024 12:02:12**

#### INVESTIGATION

On 11/03/2024 at approximately 01:43, I, Officer Joseph Basak #9124 with the Appleton Police Department, was assigned to the College Avenue Detail from 23:00 to 03:00, in full uniform, and on foot patrol in the 400 Block of West College Avenue, City of Appleton, Outagamie County, Wisconsin, 54914. While walking eastbound in the 400blk, I heard what sounded like a glass bottle brake near the doorway at Mr. Frogs; 409 West College Avenue. I then observed a male party fall down the stairs. The male appeared to be running from something.

I immediately asked the male if he was okay. The male advised he was okay, quickly stood up, and left westbound. Lieutenant West #9119 and other units were able to intercept the male

and identify him as CONTACT [REDACTED]. Moments after I checked on [REDACTED] I observed two adult males engaged in a pushing match in the entrance way. One male was trying to push into the bar and the other male was trying to keep him out of the bar. The males were holding onto each other however, they were not striking each other. I approached the the male who was trying to push his way into the bar, and instructed him to stop. Officers Ballweg #9167 and Grier-Welch #9102 secured the male's arms and stabilized him against the wall. I then detained the male by placing him in handcuffs. I checked the handcuffs for fit and comfort before safety locking them. That male was later identified via a Wisconsin identification card as CONTACT [REDACTED].

While units escorted [REDACTED] to there squad, I made contact with the other male who was trying to keep [REDACTED] outside. That male did not want to identify himself but explained he was working security for Mr. Frogs. The male explained he was trying to keep [REDACTED] outside because of a disturbance they were already dealing with inside. The male told me he was not injured, everyone was good, and he did not want anything to be done. After speaking with the male, I spoke with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] explained after observing a physical disturbance inside the bar, he exited. Once the disturbance was over, he tried to enter the bar again. At that point, the security guard told him not to come inside, which would have been when I observed the parties in a pushing match.

Another security guard walked over to me while I was speaking with [REDACTED] He told me [REDACTED] was good, was a regular, and they did not want anything done. In conclusion, [REDACTED] was not involved in a disturbance inside the bar. I believed [REDACTED] was involved in the disturbance, which would explain him exiting the bar very quickly. According to Officers that spoke with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] reported that someone had slapped him and he slapped them back. [REDACTED] did not want anything done. The other person, who allegedly slapped [REDACTED] did not contact law enforcement or try to make a complaint. At this time, there is no action as there were no injuries or any "willing victims."
